Career Development

Officers are eligible for promotion to Police Officer First Class (PFC) after two years of satisfactory sworn service. Officers at the rank of PFC and above may compete for an extensive range of specialized assignment opportunities.

Promotion to Master Police Officer is a competitive process open to PFC's with five years of satisfactory sworn service. Promotion to Sergeant, a supervisory position, is a competitive process open to PFC's with four years of satisfactory sworn service.





Necessary Qualifications

To be considered for employment, you must be able to meet the following standards:

- Must be a citizen of the United States; or a permanent resident alien with an application for naturalization filed and pending with the U.S.
 Citizenship and Immigration Services may be considered.
- Any combination of education, experience, and training equivalent to a high school diploma or a GED Certificate issued by a Board of Education and recognized by the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- Must be 20 1/2 years old, or within 180 days of 21st birthday at time of application.
- Illegal drug use will be reviewed with respect to recent use, type of drug, and frequency of use.
- Possess a valid driver's license at the time of appointment.
- Must have never committed, been involved in, pleaded guilty or no contest, or been convicted of a felony or serious misdemeanor offense, to include domestic violence or any crime of moral turpitude as an adult. A juvenile arrest will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- Must be of good character and reputation.
- Ability to perform essential job functions with or without a reasonable accommodation.
- Ability to successfully complete our 6-month Criminal Justice Academy.
- Ability to successfully complete our Field Training Program.
